A World of Motion

Briarwood Elementary School 5th Graders get visit from GM's engineering program

General Motors continues to expand its AWIM program nationwide. Programs now exist in twenty-seven GM communities throughout North America. During the month of May, Briarwood Elementary fifth graders were pleased to have the GM engineers help them make balloon-powered toy cars that meet specific performance criteria such as: travels far, carries weight, or goes fast. Jet propulsion, friction, air resistance and design are all parts of A World In Motion® (AWIM) curriculum which joins together teachers, students, and industry volunteers in an exploration of physical science while addressing essential mathematic and scientific concepts and skills. The students learn to work as a team with their classmates and apply creative problem solving during the activities

Industry volunteers play an essential role in motivating the next generation to



pursue careers in science, technology, engineering and math by bringing their everyday experiences into a classroom right in their community. Benchmarked to the national standards, each of the AWIM activities incorporate the laws of physics, motion, flight and electronics into ageappropriate hands-on activities that reinforce classroom STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) curriculum.

with expensive treatments and bandages that can cost thousands of dollars each month. The quilt was a true labor of love and giving.

Briarwood Elementary Students Join the World's Largest Exercise Class

Briarwood Elementary students were eager to help Michigan retain its record as the state with the most participation in the world's largest exercise class. On May 4, 2011, students from all 50 states as well as 50 countries participated in ACES.

ACES (All Children Exercise Simultaneously) is a one-day youth exercise program intended to highlight the importance of, and need for, youth fitness. Michigan schools have joined together in large numbers to show their commitment to helping children understand the importance of exercise in maintaining good health.

At Briarwood, the students celebrated ACES by participating in the following activities: Jazzercise, jump roping, hula hoping, and power walking. All staff and students were actively engaged for 15 minutes. This is Briarwood's eleventh year



of participation and is only one of the ways that lifelong fitness is encouraged. During the school year, students learn about healthy lifestyles, participate in physical fitness classes and challenges, and learn about the importance of including all food groups in their diets.

Westwood Kindergartners Raise Money For The Michigan Humane Society



On December 10, 2010, the Westwood PTC held a Santa Shoppe at Westwood. There, the kindergarten class had a bake sale to raise money for the Michigan Humane Society. A week later Ron Blout brought and his dog, Poco, came to Westwood to visit students and teach them about the Michigan Humane Society (MHS).

The MHS isn't just for dog and cat rescue either. Mr. Ron Blout explained that there have been many kinds of animals brought into the facility...a black panther, a tiger, a bear, and a crocodile amongt others.

In an interactive presentation, Mr. Ron taught the classes about what to do around unfamiliar animals. If you meet someone with a dog, ask the owner if you can approach the dog. If yes, walk up to the animal slowly with your hand open and facing down. Once the dog has made your acquaintance and has accepted you, then, and only then, should you pet the dog. Never put your face to the dog and always go slow. In the event that you come across a charging or dangerous animal, cross your arms, stand still, and look downward. Never look at the animal in the eyes. Mr. Ron had the students practice all of these actions to help them remember the steps.

In the end, thanks to the PTC organized bake sale and the families that donated the baked goods, the kindergarten class was able to donate a check in the amount of \$165 to the Michigan Humane Society. This money will be put toward the cruelty and abuse part of the organization. Before leaving, all of the students were able to practice their just-taught skills by coming up to meet, and some to feed, the birthday dog. Yes, that day Poco turned 1-year-old.
