Extended COVID-19 Learning Plan (Section 98a) for the 2020-2021 School Year

Reconfirmation Meeting: December 14, 2020

(Required 30 Days after Initial Plan Approval and Every Month Thereafter)

- **Reconfirm how instruction is going to be delivered during the 2020-2021 school year**
- Not later than 30 calendar days after a school district/public school academy (PSA) receives notification that their Extended COVID-19 Learning Plan has been approved by their Intermediate School District/Authorizer, and every calendar month thereafter, the district/PSA must reconfirm the manner in which instruction is going to be delivered during the 2020-2021 school year.
- **Public comments from parents and/or guardians**
- Reconfirmation must occur at a meeting of the district's board of education/PSA's board of directors, and the district/PSA must solicit public comment from the parents and legal guardians of student enrolled in the district.
- **Review weekly 2-way interaction rates**
- The school district must publicly announce its weekly 2-way interaction rates at each reconfirmation meeting.

Changes to Delivery of Instruction

December 14
through
December 20

- **PreSchool** – no changes
- **K-5** – In-person Learning for face-to-face students through Dec. 18; virtual learners continue as normal
- **6-8**– In-person Learning for face-to-face students through Dec. 18; virtual learners continue as normal
- **9-12** – Remote Learning for face-to-face through Dec. 18; virtual learners continue as normal
- Special Education students are scheduled for face-to-face instruction as dictated by Individual Education Plans

Changes to Delivery of Instruction

January 4
through
January 15

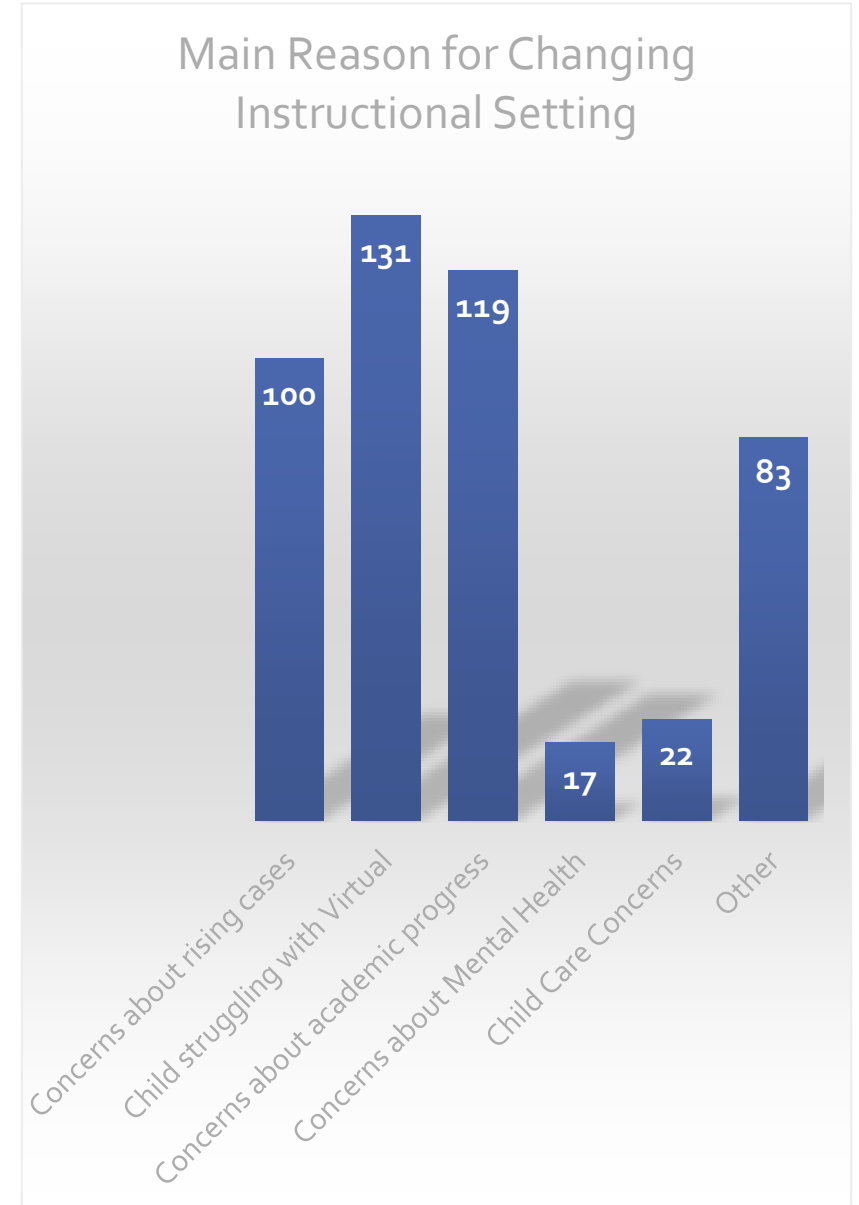
- **PreSchool** – no changes
- **K-5** – In-person Learning for face-to-face students through Jan. 13; Asynchronous lessons for in-person and virtual learners will be posted January 14 & 15
- **6-8** – Remote Learning for face-to-face students through Jan. 13; Asynchronous lessons for in-person and virtual learners will be posted January 14 & 15
- **9-12** – Remote Learning for face-to-face through Jan. 15; virtual learners continue as normal; recommend not administering final exams for first semester, grades will be 50% 1st Quarter and 50% 2nd Quarter
- Special Education students are scheduled for face-to-face instruction as dictated by Individual Education Plans

January 13, 14 & 15

- **K-5** – January 14 & 15 No “onsite” in-person classes. All students will be remote and teachers will post asynchronous lessons for students to access.
- **6-8** – January 14 & 15 will be asynchronous
- **K-8** Teachers will use this time to prepare for the students who will be leaving or joining their classes beginning January 19
- **9-12** January 13-14 at WWT “Regular” school days due to no Exams
- Friday, January 15 is a half day for all students

Changes to Delivery of Instruction Third Quarter

- Parents completed a commitment form for their choice of learning for Third Quarter.
- Approximately 15% chose to switch to the opposite learning format.
- Of that 15 %:
 - 30% switched to virtual
 - 70% switched to in-person
- Average addition of 14 students at each grade level.
- Approximately 49% Virtual and 51% In-Person for Third Quarter



Next Steps

- Principals and Counselors will begin to reschedule students based on their choice for Third Quarter
- Parents will be notified of any changes to their child's teacher the week of January 11
- Next recommitment will be January 11, 2020
- No School for all Monday, January 18
- New Quarter starts Tuesday, January 19
