Our entire team would like to thank the community for its partnership and support during the past school year. When we began the 2021-2022 school year, we had

high hopes for a return to "normal" - the excitement of new construction projects and technology, the return of traditions like Popsicles on the Playground, Schoolapalooza and Homecoming Pep Rally. While we were able to enjoy many reassuring normalcies, we also encountered the traumatic effects that two years of a pandemic inflicts on the young lives we are trusted to prepare for the future.

Warren Woods is proud to have provided in-person instruction for interested families since September of 2020. We welcomed over 96% of our students back to in-person classes in September of 2021. We felt it was extremely important for students to have the opportunity to work face-to-face with staff and peers for their academic and social emotional growth. I cannot imagine where we would be if our students had not had that option. How much more trauma would we be dealing with if they had not seen the smlling faces of 535 loving employees who come to work in Warren Woods on a daily basis? We could not have done this without every one of our staff members pouring their heart and soul into making Warren Woods a safe and caring learning environment. I will forever be grateful for the opportunity to work with them.

As we look forward to the 2022-2023 school year, I continue to be confident and optimistic. I am confident that we will continue to provide the best environment to learn and work. While we continue to have an uphill climb to overcome the scars left by the pandemic, our team is up to the challenge. We have so many additional supports in place for the upcoming school year - for students and staff.

- This summer, we are hosting the largest summer school program we have ever had with over 250 students enrolled in grades K-5 and over 230 students at the secondary level.
- We are looking forward to launching in-school 1:1 device accessibility for all high school students in the fall. All high school students will have access to a laptop in every course.
- In addition, we are also introducing all new classroom technology at the high schools in the fall. Each room will be equipped with a Smart panel, document camera and sound system thanks to the generous support of our community on our 2020 Bond Issue.
- We are also introducing a new math program for grades K through 5 in September. A thorough investigation and pilot program took place the last two years, and we are excited to embark upon the Bridges Math program. We anticipate that the new tools and resources will help teachers and students alike.

Like every September, the 2022-2023 school year will represent a fresh start for all of us. I know that our strong partnership will allow us to make our incredible school district even better. I look forward to seeing all of you along Martin for the Homecoming Parade on October 8!


#### WWT Partners with MCC to Implement Certified Nursing Assistant Program



Meetings are open to the public. The community is welcome to attend. Board meeting agendas are posted the Friday before each meeting at the Administrative Service Center at every school during from September through June.


