

## **Instructional Waiver**

- The school schedule is modified so that students are allotted time to meet with teachers in which that they can work one on one.
- Students were able to receive over 100+ hours of individualized instruction time with teachers.
- Other students are required to work on missing assignments or get extra instruction from teachers
- The school has seen a dramatic increase in passing grades since the waiver started
- The current plan for the 2015/2016 school year is to continue on with the S.I.T. program.






## After-school tutoring

- Mrs. Mulla works with students on missing assignments and make-up work
  - The program has allowed seniors extra time to work on E2020 classes
  - Mrs. Mulla provides one-on-one instruction for students who need extra help and guidance
