THE EHS STAFF IS SO PROUD OF THE CLASS OF 2018. THE MICHIGAN DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION REPORTS POST – SECONDARY ENROLLMENT UP 13 PERCENT FROM LAST YEAR.

Warren Woods Enterprise High School Coordinator, Mr. George Hamblin, is proud to announce that there were 63 total high school graduates from Enterprise High School (EHS) in June, 2018. This year’s graduating class is the largest graduation class in the last seven years. The EHS seven-year average (2012—2018) number of graduates is now at 46 students per year.

Four EHS students received EHS scholarships for their books and tuition for college in the fall including Cortney Benenati, Dye’Mond Brown, Ashley Shepich, and Kaila Williams. In addition, Cortney Benenati received special recognition and an art award from Mrs. Stasinski for her outstanding effort in art classes. Also, Mrs. Jennings awarded the Jennings’ Scholarships to Jamar Demano and Courtney Wheeler.

EHS counselor, Mr. Jason Nostrant, continues to lead the EHS commitment to helping students find career and educational opportunities after graduation. Teaming with Mrs. Cooper, Mr. Nostrant is expanding programs to include the Michigan Rehabilitation Services. Also, Ms. Smith has continued to upgrade the library with more books, tables, chairs, and shelving. In addition, Ms. Smith received scholarships for EHS students so they could attend the Henry Ford Museum. Mrs. Stasinski and Mr. Nostrant took students to the Detroit Institute of Arts in May.

Mr. Kreger and Mrs. Jennings worked together with students to create a new butterfly garden in the EHS courtyard. Also, the staff welcomed math teacher, Mrs. Potter, to our team.

THE STAFF AT EHS CONTINUES TO BE ENCOURAGED BY THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS THAT COMPLETED THEIR GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS. THE 2017-2018 SCHOOL YEAR SAW SIXTY-TWO STUDENTS GRADUATE WITH HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMAS.

EHS STUDENTS AGAIN HAD TO PREPARE FOR AND TAKE A VARIETY OF STANDARDIZED TESTS. THE EHS TEAM, LED BY MR. KREGER, MS. SMITH, MR. JASON NOSTRANT, AND MRS. COOPER, GUIDED STUDENTS THROUGH THE SAT AND ACT WORK KEYS TESTS IN APRIL ALONG WITH THE STATE MANDATED M-STEP TESTING. OTHER FORMAL ASSESSMENTS THAT WERE USED TO GAUGE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT WERE THE NWEA TESTS IN THE FALL AND SPRING, THE PSAT TEST FOR TENTH GRADERS, AND THE PSAT AND SAT REVIEW TESTS IN DECEMBER.
